Every session starts at zero.

Every AI assistant an operator uses — whichever brand is on the box — opens each conversation as a stranger. Brilliant, fast, tireless, and carrying nothing forward. Not your clients. Not your standards. Not the correction you gave it yesterday.

THE FRAMEWORK

The Briefing Stack

Five layers. Every tool on the market has all five under different names. Most operators have built one.

01	IDENTITY Who you are, who you serve, what you sell	Custom instructions, or a project file the tool reads first
02	RULES How the work must be done, and what finished looks like	Voice, format, terminology, spelling, deliverable shape
03	MEMORY Decisions already made, so they stay made	Saved notes the tool can reach. The layer that compounds
04	LIMITS What must never happen, under any instruction	A deny list is a lock. A written rule is only a request
05	MOVES The procedures you run more than once	Saved prompts, skills, commands. Built last, not first

DEFENSE BEFORE OFFENSE

The order it reads is not the order you build.

IT READS

Identity → Rules → Memory
→ Limits → Moves

Top to bottom, every session, in about two seconds.

YOU BUILD

Limits → Identity → Rules
→ Memory → Moves

Put the locks on before you hand over the keys. Moves are the fun part and the last part.

TEST YOUR OWN SETUP TONIGHT

Three questions.

If you opened a new session right now, **what would it already know** about your business without you typing anything?
- 2

What is on your **never list** — and have you ever actually opened the file it lives in?
- 3

What correction have you now given **the same tool twice**, and why is it not written down yet?

You are not using AI.
You are writing the briefing a stranger reads every morning.

Map → Build → Evolve. Capability, not dependency.
